
RONGOMAI NEWS: (ROOM 2)



REMEMBER YOUR W. I. T. S.

We use our WITS as our 'go to' strategy for teaching children to make safe and positive choices when faced with peer conflict. The WITS acronym – Walk away, Ignore, Tell someone, and Stay calm & talk it through – provides a common language that children and adults in their environments can use to talk about, and respond to, when dealing with an issue. We are integrating them into our school culture and role modelling them daily. We ask you to take some time to discuss & practise this strategy with your tamariki. 😊
