HĀMUA NEWS: (ROOM 3)



Cultural Festival practices are full - we have 2 weeks to go. There is a special notice about this today. We hope to see as many of you as possible there on the day.



PLEASE MAKE SURE THAT THE UNIFORM ITEMS ARE CLEARLY NAMED.


