 This term we will be closing the school for instruction on **Friday 25th August** for our school's Mid Term Break.




TAMARIKI ENJOY VISIT TO THE LOCAL MARAE



Has your tamariki got a sticky, puffy eye?


Bacterial Conjunctivitis is very common, particularly among younger children, and can be easily treated with eyedrops.
