PROJECT DEVELOPMENT - ALL WEATHER TURF GRANT SUCCESS!!



I'm so excited and proud to announce that Eketahuna School BOT and Home & School have been granted a combined amount of \$50,000 to pay for a new all weather turf for our school!

The Home and School Association applied to TrustHouse who granted an amazing \$20,000. In the BOT were granted a further \$10,000 from Eastern and Central Community Trust and In another \$20,000 from Grassroots Central Trust. This money will cover the laying of the Turf, In prep work, fencing, hockey goal and netball hoops. Further to this the Eketahuna Tennis Club In have generously donated for loan one of their movable tennis nets, this is such a kind and Inthoughtful loan and will save the school a lot of money in buying a new net.

The new all weather turf will cover the area behind Putara and Nireaha classes where the old concrete tennis court is currently. There will be lines on the turf for both hockey and netball, and possibly tennis. This will be a huge asset for our school and we are all so grateful to the above trusts for their generous support! It is a possibility in the future that we can get the turf covered providing a big area for our children to play sheltered from both rain and sun, however this is a longer term goal. It is hoped that the turf will be installed during the summer holidays, providing the prep work can be completed first.

This is another project that again wouldn't have been possible without our wonderful Home and School Association, our next meeting is on the 10th October 7pm in the staff room. This meeting we will be into planning and organising for the spring show, so if you have any ideas for the spring show come along and be part of a fantastic group. The Home and School fundraisers work really hard so our kids can have all the extra resources and opportunities such as chrome books, new swing set (coming very soon), swimming lessons, new books, heated pool, bus trips, school camp, soccer nets, sports equipment, sports uniforms and so much more. EDUCATION REVIEW OFFICE REPORT CONFIRMED

We are delighted to express our immense satisfaction with the Profile Report recently received from the Education Review Office. The report not only acknowledges our unwavering commitment to educational excellence but also highlights the dedication of our staff, the engagement of our students, and the effectiveness of our programs. This recognition further fuels our determination to continue fostering an environment of continuous improvement and superior learning outcomes for all our students.

Te Ara Huarau is the evaluation approach that the Education Review Office (ERO) is using in our school. This is a developmental approach to evaluation where ERO and our school work together over time rather than one off reviews that happened previously. Te Ara Huarau is used in most English-medium state and state-integrated schools.

ERO maintains a regular review programme to evaluate and report on the education and care of young people in the schools. Our school worked alongside ERO to write our Profile Report. This type of report will only happen once as part of our initial engagement with Te Ara Huarau. The profile report reflects our strategic goals and a shared evaluation focus on one or more areas

that are important to us as we work together to improve outcomes for all our learners. ERO, like us, has a strong focus on equity and excellence. Future reporting will show our progress and achievement towards meeting the goals we have set. Public reports like the Profile Report are published on ERO's website.

A Board Assurance Report that shows how we are meeting regulatory and legislative Requirements has also been published. A copy of our Profile Report is included with this week's newsletter.
